## A word about our place...

The Hidden Hollows Retreat is also our home. We are in love with it, and we invite you to fall in love with it too! It consists of 67 acres of meadow and forest, three ponds and several hollows, or ravines, in the forest. The hollows are part of the watershed where the flat farmlands of rural Northern Indiana merge with the Wabash River. We are in that transition zone, a special place in the American Midwest, about 35 miles west and south of Fort Wayne, IN, midway between Huntington and Wabash. We were married in one of the hollows before there was any construction on the land. Our home was designed for use as a retreat center or meeting place, for workshops or gatherings with a focus on spiritual concerns, education or personal growth. We also welcome the person or couple that just wants to recharge their batteries in a quiet, nurturing, natural, pastoral setting.



We welcome group retreats for people who desire to grow in some way, or who want to celebrate life or a life event. Weddings or reunions are welcome. Your group's interest might range from Alphorns to Zithers, from discussing Soup to selecting Nuts, from Art to Zen, and a whole lot of other things in between that we can't imagine—you tell us. We are open to just about anything (legal, of course) that you might want to do. Off-site staff meetings? Sure! We have no formal affiliation with any religious, civic, or political organization and we are very open in considering how we could serve as your hosts.



The main pond near the house is suitable for swimming—at your own risk. You are invited to walk the many trails through the woods and the prairie grasses, amble through the Butterfly Garden or the rock gardens, relax on the Hickory Deck Dock (uh, that would be a deck sheltered by a large hickory tree in a grove at the edge of the pond), spend some quiet time at the meditation garden, or simply watch the chickens. You may also want to inspect our organic garden from which we get much of our produce and herbs.

Yes, the place is pastoral, but also modern.
